- embroidery scissors, very sharp
- sharp pencil or mechanical pencil is best
- iron/travel iron
- foam core board (available at office supply stores) for use as ironing surface
- rotary cutter, mat and ruler
- notepad and pencil

- 18 x 17-inch cotton batting
- 8-inch dressmakers shears
- paper scissors
- rotary cutter, mat and ruler
- very fine-point marker such as a Sharpie extra fine
- Prismacolor pencil in a light color (blue or yellow)
- notepad and pencil

- painter's drop cloth
- disposable gloves
- wear old clothing and/or apron
- notepad and pencil

Unique Beading Tricks With Mary Stori

- embroidery scissors or thread clippers
- 8 or 10-inch wooden embroidery hoop and enough muslin fabric to fit hoop
- hand-sewing needle size 10 or 11 is recommended
- small shallow dish, avoid plastic if possible
- notepad and pencil

Optional 11-inch PVC quilting frame, appliqué/sharp needle size 10 or 11, portable task light (such as a collapsible Ott light)
